SOUTHERN IOWA ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE, INC. MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING OF MEMBERS September 7, 2017

- •The 78th Annual Meeting of the Members of Southern Iowa Electric Cooperative, Inc. was held at the Cooperative's office building at 22458 Highway 2 in Bloomfield, Iowa beginning at 6:30 P.M. on September 7, 2017.
- •The meeting was called to order by Darrell Downing, President of the Cooperative, who presided. Joy Evans, Secretary of the Cooperative, acted as Secretary of the meeting and kept the minutes thereof.
- Pastor Donna Olinger of the Troy United Methodist Church gave an invocation.
- •The Chairman introduced CEO/Manager Greg Proctor who welcomed the members. The National Anthem was played.
- •The CEO/Manager then introduced the Directors and special guests, including representatives from neighboring Cooperatives, legislators and statewide organizations. He also gave special recognition to the members of the armed forces and recognized the employees with twenty (20) and more years of service.
- •The CEO/Manager Greg Proctor introduced Rand Fisher of the Iowa Area Development Group who presented the Cooperative with an Impact Award for Community Development.
- •The Chairman held a number of drawings for prizes awarded to those who mailed in their ballots and to a number of children.
- •The Chairman announced that the meeting would be conducted in accord with Roberts Rules of Order and that the Cooperative's Attorney, Mark Landa, had been appointed parliamentarian.
- •The Secretary, Joy Evans, announced that it had been determined from the registration of members that a quorum of the members was present in person. The Chairman then declared the Annual Meeting of the Members legally convened for the transaction of any and all business that may properly come before it.
- •The Secretary read the Official Notice of the meeting, copies of which were mailed to each of the members. An Affidavit of Mailing the Notice was executed by the Secretary and the Notice and Affidavit were ordered to be annexed to the minutes of this meeting.
- •The Secretary announced that the minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Members of the Cooperative held on September 8, 2016 had been mailed to the members with the Notice of the Meeting and she thereupon moved to waive the reading of the minutes. The motion was seconded and carried and the minutes were ordered to be filed in the records of the Cooperative.
- •The Treasurer, David Yahnke, announced that printed copies of the Annual Financial Report of the Cooperative had been distributed to each of the members and he thereupon made a motion to dispense with the reading of the report. The motion was seconded and carried, whereupon the report was declared to be approved, and it was ordered to be filed in the records of the Cooperative.
- •The Chairman introduced Attorney Landa who supervised the election of directors. Attorney Landa announced that the candidates for director had been nominated by a nominating committee consisting of the following members: Leonard Besick, Orval Stevenson, Lyle Spurgeon, Charles Warner and Gary Horn, Vice Chairman. Attorney Landa next introduced Susan Hougland, Chairman of the Committee, who presented the Nominating Committee Report, indicating that the following members had been nominated to serve as directors, with three to be elected for three year terms: Duke Ball, Stephanie Bassett, Wayne Birchmier, Rex Harris, Earl Trachsel, Dave Yahnke and Fred Zeitler.
- •Attorney Landa announced that Cooperative members Marvin Strait, Karen Cantrell, Phyllis Ward, Ernest Birchmier and Marietta Huggins had been appointed as Inspectors of Election.
- •Following a last call for ballots, a motion was made, seconded and carried to close the balloting. The balloting was then declared closed so that the counting and tabulation of ballots could be completed.
- •The Chairman noted that Trevor Albert, John Davis, Kelly Lynch, Dylan Bragg and Haze Goodson were the 2017 Scholarship winners.
- •The Chairman announced that Lauren Starnes and Lindsey Starnes were the winners of the Cooperative's NRECA Youth Tour competition and had participated in the Youth Tour to Washington, D.C. earlier this year. Lauren and Lindsey presented a report on their trip to D.C.
- •The Chairman introduced CEO/Manager Greg Proctor for his report on the operation of the Cooperative. He explained the Cooperative's demand and energy charges, he described the Cooperative's rate and cost structure and discussed methods of determining the best way of communicating with the membership.
- •The Chairman introduced Chuck Soderberg, the Executive Vice President/General Manager of the Iowa Association of Electric Cooperatives (IAEC). Mr. Soderberg described the statewide association's mission and services, discussed regulatory challenges and presented information on the federal Clean Power Plan, Iowa's Energy Plan, Iowa's Energy Center, the IAEC Solar Energy Guide and the newly passed Move Over Slow Down law protecting Iowa's utility workers working along Iowa's roads and highways.
- Attorney Landa facilitated the responses to written questions that had been submitted by members and called for any old or new business. No additional business came before the meeting.
- Attorney Landa presented the Certificate of the Inspectors of Election certifying the following three directors had received the highest number of votes and had been duly elected as Directors of the Cooperative to serve three-year terms, and until their successors shall have been elected and qualified. THREE-YEAR TERM (Three to be elected) Earl Trachsel, Dave Yahnke and Fred Zeitler.
- •Prizes were awarded by lot during the meeting and entertainment was provided by Bridge City Country before the meeting. A meal was provided by Bailey's BBQ Barn and blood pressure checks were provided by Davis County Public Health.
- •There being no further business to come before the meeting, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the meeting adjourned.
