Meet SIEC's 2024 Youth Tour Winner

She will join approximately 1,800 students from cooperatives around the country for the national Youth Tour in Washington, D.C., this June. On the weeklong tour, students learn about electric cooperatives, American history, U.S. government, and walk away with a greater understanding of their role as American citizens. Nevaeh will get to participate in National Youth Day, visit with her elected legislators, and explore the sights around the nation's capital. Giving back to the community and investing in the next generation of leaders is part of every electric cooperative's mission.

TAKE CARE WHEN BURNING DITCHES

It's that time of year when people start burning off the weeds and grass in ditches. This burning helps clean things up, but it can also cause problems if a fire is allowed to burn around SIEC's poles, anchors, guy wires and underground cabinets. Burning too close to SIEC's property cannot only cause a lot of damage, but it can also be dangerous and cause electric service problems. Anyone



involved may be invoiced for damage they cause to SIEC's property. To avoid any damage to SIEC's property, electric service problems, and danger to yourself and others, please be careful where you burn.

Property taxes are used to help fund important things such as education and city and county government. You might not be aware of it, but SIEC pays property taxes. In fact, SIEC receives a tax bill for poles, wires, transformers and other equipment on the line, plus another tax bill for the office and warehouse. SIEC and Northeast Power, our power provider, pay taxes in the four counties that we serve. Below is a breakdown of the property taxes SIEC will pay in 2024:

- Appanoose County \$ 6,731.00
- Davis County \$115,098.00

- Van Buren County
- \$21,706.00
- Wapello County \$ 17,500.00
