# **APPLY TO WIN ONE OF THREE** \$2,000 SCHOLARSHIPS!

HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS whose parents or guardians are members of SIEC, with an active account, are eligible to apply. One scholarship will be awarded in each of three areas determined by membership totals: Appanoose/Van Buren Counties, Davis County and Wapello County. Applicants must be accepted by an accredited two- or four-year college, university or vocational-technical school for the fall of 2025, and must be a U.S. citizen. ## **DID YOU KNOW...**

In accordance with Iowa Code 476.6A, the owner of any alternate energy production facility (solar, wind, etc.) that is attached to the Cooperative lines is required to provide written notification to the Cooperative of the intent to install the facility at least 30 days prior to construction. The appropriate Interconnection Agreement must also be completed and signed by the member and the Cooperative before installation on Cooperative lines occur. ## **ENTRY DEADLINE IS FEBRUARY 28, 2025**



- Review and follow all manufacturer directions.
- Plug space heaters directly into outlets; avoid using an extension cord.
- Always remember to turn off space heaters when not in use and before going to bed.
- Many fires start when flammable products are placed too close to heating devices, such as space heaters. Space heaters should be kept at least 3 feet from blankets, clothing, paper, and other flammables.
- Place space heaters out of high-traffic areas and on a level, hard, non-flammable floor surface — NOT on carpets, furniture, or countertops.
- Be aware of pets and children near heating appliances.
- Keep space heaters away from water.
- Regularly examine cords to make sure there is no cracking or fraying.
